CITRUS SPP. (a partial listing) -----

(Citron, grapefruit, lemon, lime, mandarin, orange, tangerine)

For all commodities to all countries, ACOs should review requirements in Product Requirements and all categories in General Information

FRUIT ----plant part----

FROM CA ----sub part----

- From Los Angeles County and Orange County
 - From fruit fly quarantine areas

Prohibited.

- From areas not under fruit fly quarantine
 - Oranges only

Phytosanitary certificate (PC) is required. Must be free from *Septoria citri* (septoria spot) and *Aonidiella aurantii* (California red scale).

Additional Declarations that,

1) "This shipment has been produced and packed in an area outside of the quarantine areas for fruit flies."

AND,

2) "The fruit in the shipment meets all the program requirements for the export of California oranges to Korea and was inspected and found free from *Septoria citri*." Refer to ([/GEN Work Plan for the Shipment of California Oranges to Korea/](#)) for details. Note that oranges from Fresno and Tulare counties have latency testing requirements.

Host fruit passing through the quarantine areas must be moved in closed vehicles or completely enclosed by coverings and should not be opened or reloaded within the quarantine areas.

The State and county of origin must be listed in the "Place of Origin" block of the PC.

Must be treated with one of the following options to control *Aonidiella aurantii*:

- Methyl bromide fumigation at origin or on arrival. If methyl bromide fumigation is given at origin, the treatment must be on the PC.

OR,

- Hydrogen cyanide (HCN) fumigation on arrival. (Fumigation at origin is **NOT** an option.)

10-20 C, 3g/m³ for 1 hour

NOTE TO EXPORTER: HCN treatment will only be conducted on arrival upon request by importer.

- Citron, grapefruit, lemon, lime, mandarin and tangerine

Phytosanitary certificate (PC) is required. Must be free from *Septoria citri* (septoria spot).

Additional Declarations that,

1) "This shipment has been produced and packed in an area outside of the quarantine areas for fruit flies."

- From Fresno and Tulare counties
 - Oranges only

AND,

Prohibited.

- From all other CA counties (excluding Fresno, Los Angeles, Orange and Tulare)
 - Oranges only

Phytosanitary certificate (PC) is required. Must be free from *Septoria citri* (septoria spot) and *Aonidiella aurantii* (California red scale).

Additional declarations that,

1) "This shipment has been produced and packed in an area outside of the quarantine areas for fruit flies."

AND,

2) "The fruit in the shipment meets all the program requirements for the export of California oranges to Korea and was inspected and found free from *Septoria citri*." Refer to ([/GEN Work Plan for the Shipment of California Oranges to Korea/](#)) for details.
